Jérôme Salle's dazzling biopic will sweep you up in its sails as it follows the chaotic life of celebrity oceanographer Jacques Cousteau; one rich in accomplishments, yet teeming with turmoil.

It is 1943 and the eccentrically ambitious naval officer Cousteau (Lambert Wilson) dreams of adventure. His magnificent new invention of the Aqua-Lung promises to bring him just that. Newly armed with the ability to breathe underwater for long periods of time, Cousteau dedicates his life's work to his obsession with the sea, becoming the first to create underwater films that dazzle audiences worldwide.

His success comes at a cost, however, as his wife Simone (Audrey Tautou) and sons Philippe (Pierre Niney) and Jean-Michel (Benjamin Lavernhe) struggle to keep up with the stormy seas of Cousteau's fierce and unfailing determination, the ultimate price of which is yet to come.

Through a dazzling array of global exploration locations, we undertake this lyrical journey almost as if a member of Cousteau's crew, experiencing the epic highs and excruciating lows of this pioneer's astounding career which changed humanity's relationship with the sea forever.

What better way to finish a festival than with the delivery of a brand new bundle of joy? Unfortunately, this is not quite how Nicole (comedy star Karin Viard, *The Bélier Family*, AF FFF15) would view the situation in writer-director Nadège Loiseau's uproarious and emotive debut feature about a reluctant 49-year-old mother-to-be.

In a household already bursting at the seams, the almost menopausal Nicole is completely swamped with duties, barely managing to keep everything from falling apart. Comprising the four generations under her roof is her eccentric elderly mother Mamilette and her daughter Arielle along with Arielle's pesky Canadian partner Toussaint and their 6-year-old daughter Zoé. Finishing off the family tree is Nicole's husband Jean-Pierre, an unemployed ex-gymnast.

Just when life couldn't get any more hectic, Nicole finds out that she is pregnant.

Viard and this wonderfully harmonious supporting cast deliver scene after scene of pure boisterous comedic gold, as Nicole fumbles through the barrage of demands that come with pregnancy, and learns for the very first time how to sort out her own life.

The Festival has been honoured to present the World Premieres of some superb French jewels in past years and 2017 is no exception with the world debut screening of writer-director Carine Tardieu's wonderfully funny *Just to Be Sure.*

When 45-year-old widower Erwan (the fabulous François Damiens, *The Bélier Family*, AF FFF15) discovers by accident that the man who raised him isn't his real dad, he begins a search for his biological father. He soon locates the mischievous, 70-something Joseph (André Wilms, *Le Havre*, 2011), whom his mother knew briefly. Erwan falls not only for his charm, but that of the impetuous Anna (Cécile De France, *La Belle Saison*, AF FFF16), who has ties to them both. The conflicting familial loyalties soon become compounded by the pregnancy of his own daughter Juliette (Alice de Lencquesaing), who defiantly refuses to name the father.

Offering a terrific showcase for her brilliant ensemble, Tardieu (*The Dandelions*, AF FFF13) proves her skill at depicting the joys and complications of family connections and romances, both new and old, with this hugely entertaining and moving new film.

Prepare to accompany one kooky Canadian as she embarks on a whimsical trip through France's great city in this charming and entirely unique comedy which stars the two long-time Brussels-based theatre actor-directors (and real life couple) Fiona Gordon and Dominique Abel.

Fiona's (Gordon) orderly and precise life in Canada is thrown into chaos when she receives a letter of distress from her 93-year-old Aunt Martha (Academy Award-nominee Emmanuelle Riva, Amour, 2012) who is living in Paris. Immediately jumping to action. Fiona arrives in the city of lights only to discover that Martha has disappeared. So begins a hysterical search crammed with one spectacular disaster after another as Fiona desperately scours the city with her oversized red backpack, all the while tailed by an infatuated Dom (Abel), an affable, but annoying tramp who won't leave her alone.

Brimming with brilliantly timed pranks, amazing tricks and intricately choreographed slapstick in the vein of Charlie Chaplin and Jacques Tati, Lost in Paris will have you leaving the cinema with a gleeful skip in your step and a renewed zest for life

Two dimwit soldiers entirely unwilling to fight for their country venture all the way from the dank European trenches of World War II to the scorching dry sands of the Sahara in this giggle-inducing romp.

War has broken out in France in 1939 and thousands of men are being conscripted to defend their people and their country. Max (Grégoire Ludig), and Léon (David Marsais) have other priorities, which do not include the battlefield. Unfortunately, their efforts to avoid recruitment are in vain and they are thrust into their worst nightmare, immediately devising a hilarious succession of ridiculous ploys in a frenzy to extract themselves by any means possible. But the forces controlling their fate will not let them go so easily. Max and Léon quickly realise that the consequences of war are far less pleasing to their way of life than they could have anticipated.

Two barrels of physical humour, Ludig and Marsais have a firecracker chemistry, so sit back and enjoy as they turn this well-known piece of history into an explosive, inappropriate and refreshing comedy.

French comedy king Dany Boon (Lolo, AF FFF16) returns to the screen in fine form as a compulsive "penny pincher" whose parsimonious ways are upended by the surprise arrival of two new women in his life

Forty-something and single, violinist Francois Gautier's (Boon) driving motivation in life is to never spend a cent. Saving brings him joy while paying makes him break out in a sweat. His waking moments are spent devising ways to maximise his profits and minimise his losses. But within the space of 24-hours, his life is forced in an entirely new and very entertaining direction when he falls in love with his orchestra's new cellist. Valérie (Laurence Arné) and the sixteen-year-old daughter he never knew about arrives on his doorstep.

In order to conceal his shameful flaw, François builds a sticky web of lies which gets him into a sequence of awkward and hysterical situations that will have the audience in stitches. While he desperately scrambles to keep these women in his life, François begins to realise the true cost of lying in this funny and refreshing comedy about taking obsessions one step too far.

The inimitable Isabelle Huppert (Folies Bergère, AF FFF14) graces this year's Festival in this touching and endearing romantic comedy about a woman leading a secluded life who is hiding a secret past.

An unassuming model employee in a pâté factory, Liliane's (Huppert) monotonous routine is thrown into disarray when one day at work she meets the 22-year-old aspiring boxer Jean (César Award-winning Kévin Azaïs, Love at First Fight, AF FFF15) who excitedly recognises her from a European singing competition she almost won many years before. Jean's enthusiasm encourages Liliane to rediscover her talents and glory, bringing her out of the shadows and back into the spotlight. However, as Liliane's celebrity rises, Jean begins to learn the reasons that her past fame was so short-lived as old ghosts and bad habits from her bitter past resurface.

Huppert's flawless performance is peppered with humour and singing as she delicately encapsulates a woman hiding an inner struggle. Meanwhile, her sparkling chemistry with Jean results in an uplifting story that proves age is no barrier to love and it's never too late to find happiness.

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MONSIEUR CHOCOLAT | CHOCOLAT

This lively and unmissable box-office hit details the fascinating rise-and-fall story of the first popular Afro-Cuban artist of the French stage. Lavishly set in stunning Belle Époque Paris, it is beautifully realised through the energised performances of the charismatic Omar Sy (*The Intouchables*, 2011) and real-life circus-performer (and grandson of Charlie Chaplin), James Thierrée.

During the late 1800s, former slave Chocolat (Sy) is making a living in a provincial French circus performing the role of a tooth-baring cannibal named Kalanka — a surprisingly novel spectacle for the country people who have never seen a black man before. It is here that he impresses established performer George Footit (Thierrée) who takes him under his wing. Together, they develop a routine which catapults them to stardom, glamour and riches in Paris' Nouveau Cirque. However, the satisfaction of success can only last so long as Chocolat's desire for equality begins to take hold.

As entertaining as it is timely, *Monsieur Chocolat* blends sharp and impressive physical comedy with moving compassion, gloriously restoring the great legacy of this trailblazing artist.

A sprawling immersion into the pandemonium that rules life on the road with a travelling theatre troupe, this is a big-hearted second feature by French director/co-writer Léa Fehner which won over critics and audiences alike at its international premiere in Rotterdam.

Based on Anton Chekhov's weird and wonderful world of wild, nomadic freedom, "the Ogres" are a mixed bag of wicked characters played by an explosive ensemble cast including Adèle Haenel and Lola Dueñas. Led by the rough and dishonest but very appealing. Francois (played by Fehner's own father), they travel from town to town performing their extravaganza to audiences all over France. Yet the precise choreography of their act masks an intimate living situation of carefully-balanced turbulence, where the addition of fresh romances, old passions, and new children threaten to destroy a family that is comprised of much more than just blood-ties and wedding rings.

Speaking with a raw emotional honesty, Fehner draws heavily on her own experiences, bringing this cabaret delight to dazzling life and magnificently communicating an irreverent and raucous episodic adventure of those who defy convention.

As a young working-class girl living in Moscow, it was clear that Polina (Anastasia Shevtsova) had tremendous talent. With fierce determination and years of grueling training, she realises her dream when at 18 she enters the prestigious Bolshoi Ballet. Here she falls in love with Adrien (Niels Schneider), a scrupulous and charming French dancer who changes her life forever. He awakens her desire for a new and inspired way of expressing herself, leading her to discover the shining modern dance guru Liria Elsaj (Juliette Binoche, The Wait, AF FFF16) in France. Although Polina's path is strewn with hardship, her inspiring talent, perseverance and desire edge her ever closer to an incredible destiny.

As the storming of the Bastille becomes more imminent, tensions rise within the palace walls. Amongst the hectic commotion and amusingly confused and clueless noblemen, Sidonie comes to realise that the queen's highest favour may not in fact lie with her, but with another. Unwilling to accept this state of affairs, the crafty Sidonie puts her intelligence to use, hatching a cunning ploy to win the affection she so desperately craves.

Feeling repressed in the shadows of her prodigy brother, 14-year-old Nannerl (a sublime performance by director René Féret's daughter, Marie) harbours a desperate desire to create music for which she is cruelly mocked. Despite her own brilliance, she is relegated to accompany her brother Wolfgang on the piano, her father forbidding her from playing the violin, claiming it to be an instrument unfit for a girl. Frustrated by the limitations placed on her, Nannerl discovers romance through the Dauphin (Clovis Fouin) who nurtures Nannerl's dreams of acceptance both as a musician and a woman.

Partly filmed in the stunning Palace of Versailles, this handsome period piece conjures a breathtaking world of 18th-century pre-revolutionary France. By bringing an exuberant era alive with the joy of music, this inspirational tale of creative passion is destined to be adored by music and cinema lovers alike.

Embark on an inspirational cinematic experience with veteran writer-director Bertrand Tavernier's sprawling and deeply personal epic voyage through French cinema. Tavernier masterfully explores the auteurs from the 1930s up to his own first breakout feature in 1974, *The Clockmaker of St. Paul.*

Included in the analysis are the contributions of directors such as Jacques Becker and François Truffaut and actors such as Jean Renoir and Jean Gabin balanced with those of lesser known French filmmakers who have also illuminated emotions and revealed surprising truths. Hundreds of clips comprise this magnificent tribute to French filmmakers, scriptwriters, actors, and musicians with rare and behindthe-scenes insights that are eye-opening, scandalous and funny.

Tavernier's revelatory dissection draws a reference line to the influences of American cinema at the time. Through this comparison, he celebrates the quintessence of French filmmaking – the extraordinary style, uninhibited morals and graceful pessimism that have made it one of the strongest cinema industries of today. This is essential viewing for all lovers of French film, and cinema itself.

Her conservative rural family is at a loss with what to do with her obsessive and lofty ideals. To Gabrielle's horror, they enlist José, a poor Spanish bricklayer to marry her and turn her into a respectable woman. When she is admitted to a health centre for months of treatment and meets André (Garrel), a lieutenant wounded in the Indochina War, her body and mind erupt with the feelings she has so long craved, and she is determined to preserve this at any cost.

Presented in competition in the 2016 Cannes Film Festival, this sweeping tale explores the very depths of female desire, and ends with a revelation of powerful and enduring love.

Daring prodigy of the international film world, Xavier Dolan (*Mommy* 2015, *Laurence Anyways*, AF FFF13) returns with an ensemble of A-list French actors in this ambitious sixth feature which won the Grand Jury Prize at the 2016 Cannes Film Festival.

After a 12-year absence, prize-winning dramatist Louis (Gaspard Ulliel, *Saint-Laurent*, AF FFF15) returns home to tell his estranged family that he is terminally ill. Upon his arrival, he is greeted with bickering and recriminations from his family who have been left behind. Beneath their affections for Louis, each encounter shows the confusion and disappointment felt by his long unexplained departure. As old tensions begin to surface, the gathering of his mother (Nathalie Baye), brother (Vincent Cassel), sister (Léa Seydoux) and meek sister-in-law (Marion Cotillard) develops from a tight-lipped greeting into a fully-formed storm. All the while, the beautiful and doomed Louis is waiting for his moment to break the news.

Adapted from Jean-Luc Lagarce's acclaimed stage play, Dolan's claustrophobic close-ups and touches of black comedy intensify the raw melodrama of what is altogether an electrifying and engrossing portrayal of family dynamics.

When the handsome Viscount Julien de Lamare (Swann Arlaud) asks for her hand in marriage, she fantasises that the years to follow will be brimming with dreamy afternoons of flower beds bathed in dappled sunlight. Yet fate holds a very different destiny for this woman's life. Betrayed by her husband, her son, and in many ways, her own idyllic youth, we follow Jeanne through the passing of time, as her dreams turn to disillusionments

A revelation in the title role, Chemla effortlessly encapsulates an expansive range of emotions and character developments while exceptional camera work, production design and costumes recreate every detail of Jeanne's world with a majesty that will undoubtedly resonate with male and female audiences alike.

With this film, acclaimed Japanese master of fear Kiyoshi Kurosawa has created an engaging and gorgeously atmospheric ghost story, resurrecting a long-lost art form in a way that will both haunt and linger.

A Gothic tale resplendent with intrigue, Daguerrotype invites us to delve into the world of Jean (Rahim, Les Anarchistes, AF FFF16), a young unskilled Parisian who lands an unlikely position working as the assistant to famed obsessive photographer Stéphane (Gourmet). Within the isolated confines of a vast, decaving mansion, Jean helps him to create vivid, life-sized daguerreotypes - one of the oldest forms of still photography which captures images on a silver plate. Most often, these are taken of Stéphane's daughter and muse, Marie (an impeccable Constance Rousseau), who longs to escape the pervasive gloom of her father's house, and sees Jean as the way to break free.

Kurosawa effortlessly moves beyond his native Japan for the first time with this French-language offering that is as alluring as it is fascinating. As an intricate pattern of desire and ambition develops, the audience will be hypnotised by the chilling climax of this beguiling film.

Armed with the information that a mocha-coloured Mercedes was responsible, Diane ventures from her Swiss home of Lausanne, across Lake Geneva to the French spa town of Évian-les-Bains, where she encounters the potentially guilty couple Marlène (Baye) and Michel (Clavel). Grief and her uncompromising desire for revenge drive Diane to assume an alias and proceed to connivingly integrate herself into the fabric of the couple's lives, her intentions growing ever darker as she becomes more confident of her convictions.

Subtle and enthralling, Devos is utterly transfixing as the majestic mountains hang ominously over her every move. When suspicions heighten, the tension mounts, leaving little for the viewer to do but hold their breath in anticipation as Diane edges ever closer to the truth.

In possession of said phone (and entirely unaware of its contents) is a duo of even more unfortunate travelling souls, the homeless Willy (David Murgia) and his fragile, fearful girlfriend, Esther (Aurore Broutin). As the two pairs inch closer to collision, a string of unexpected encounters and occurrences result in unfortunate collateral fallout replete with philosophical wit, dry humour and deadpan Belgian surrealism.

Combining an absorbing country-music soundscape with a steely aesthetic and wickedly charming characters. The First. the Last is a true gem of original storytelling, which blends melancholy with optimism to make for a unique and hugely entertaining cinematic experience.
